## **Guidelines, Benefits & Obligations for WEEK-LONG Workshops**

## i. Guidelines on Participation and Development of a Curriculum Module

- 1. Interested faculty must submit an application to the MIIIE Director in order to participate in a workshop and to develop a curriculum module (see application form).
- 2. If admitted, the faculty must fill-out and process a registration (see registration forms).
- 3. During the workshops, the faculty participants will receive materials, a format, and information on pedagogical tools and approaches of developing a curriculum module.
- 4. The faculty will choose a variety of lectures, discussions, case-studies, assignments, readings, and resources to be infused at different sections of the course, which at minimum should comprise 12% of the course (or cumulatively, two-weeks of a 15-week semester). - 5. The faculty will receive feedback and suggestions for her/his curriculum module.
- 6. The first draft of the curriculum module is due December 31 and the final draft is due the following year, May 31.

## ii. Benefits provided by the Midwest Institute & NRC partners

- \$1,000 (or \$500) stipends will be provided to the faculty for participating in a workshop, develop a curriculum module, and make a 20-30 minutes presentation regarding the module in one of the two upcoming MIIIE conferences.
- 2. Curriculum materials, access to electronic resources, and feedback on module drafts.

## iii. Obligations by the Faculty and/or his/her College

- 1. Each faculty participating in a workshop will develop a curriculum module approved by the MIIIE Director.
- 2. See registration form.
- 3. Faculty must make a presentation on her/his module at one of the two upcoming MIIIE conferences.
- 4. Faculty is teaching at a college member of the Midwest Institute consortium.
